He also teaches part-time at the National Institute of art & Design named after K.Begzad on specialty "Restoration of applied art works" from 2005.

He has been an international correspondent for the Asia-Pacific Cultural Center of UNESCO (ACCU Nara) since 2009.

He has repeatedly taken part in international trainings and projects.
