

## Prof. Dr. Sanjeev Singh

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Dr. Sanjeev Singh holds a Bachelor's degree in architecture from the Government College of Architecture (Now Faculty of Architecture, AKTU, UP) India, a Master's degree in environmental studies from University of Melbourne, Australia, and a PhD from National University of Singapore. His research interests are in the field of Vernacular Architecture, Cultural Landscapes and environmental studies. He initiated Vernacular Studio at SPA Bhopal and has publications that refer to his interest areas. He has guided several final year thesis projects where design Philosophy was related to vernacular architecture.

Dr. Sanjeev Singh has been a Professor of Architecture at School of Planning and Architecture, Bhopal since 2010. Previously, he has also served as Architect SO/SD at Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, India from 1992-1994, and has been an Associate Professor at Integral University, Lucknow, India from 2002-2009. He has teaching and practice experience of over 30 years and has taught subjects of Vernacular Architecture, Cultural Landscapes, and Environmental Studies. He has held several administrative positions in his teaching career ranging from being the Registrar, the Head of the Department, Department of Architecture. He has also held several positions of Dean in various capacities like the Dean, Planning and development and the Dean, Student Welfare. He has been on various academic and non-academic committees of several National Institutes in the capacity of an expert member. He has been the recipient of *AISAID Scholarship, 1994* by the Government of Australia and the *Postgraduate Research Scholarships, 1998* by National University of Singapore, Singapore.

His academic excellence manifests via his publications. He has been a mentor to the students' group that won the Students Charrette of World Architecture Festival 2015 and 2016 in a row. Several other awards have been won by his students whom he has mentored. He has been on the scientific committee of Journal of Traditional Architecture and Urbanism, Madrid and for ISVS seminars 10, 11 and 12.
